WSO representatives must have

The duties are simple: attend meetings (1 WSO business conference, 2 Region V assemblies), provide a written report of actions in those meetings, and generally keep the intergroup

HOW TO SPONSOR AN EVENT!

- 1. Discuss the idea at your meeting. Choose a theme/title. Always keep in mind the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions when considering topics, speakers and activities for your event.
- 2. Decide on the possible month, day of the week, hours, and place for the event. Decide if it should be a recovery workshop, marathon, or social event. You are free to plan your event at any reasonably priced, centrally located venue.

Note: If you are planning to have the workshop at Elmhurst Hospital, you will contact Dawn A. at 331-221-6338, and she will help you with the availability and details. Our usual room is the Oak Room and the set up is called Classroom style, *w/* tables and chairs (for 70?) *w/* tables around the room and also in the hall for registration. The acceptable donation here is \$50 for the room and a dollar for every person over 50 participants.

- 3. Have your Intergroup Rep. attend the next IG meeting with the details that were discussed at your meeting.
- 4. Here is where you will find out if there are conflicting events, such conventions or other workshops from our IG or neighboring IGs. You will be also be given the IG Guidelines for Speakers, and the list of OA Approved Literature which can be quoted or referenced at the event. No non-approved materials can be mentioned, shown, or referred to at an OA event.
- 5. Next your group will develop a flyer for publication which will contain Overeaters Anonymous, as well as the group's name added to "Sponsored by Chi-Wif and the ______ group". Details should be concisely explained on the flyer. Admission should include "Suggested donation of ______ no one will be turned away." All Chi-Wif sponsored events are open to any interested individuals. The contact persons listed should be by first name only, remembering our Anonymity.
- 6. When the flyer is in its rough draft stage, please bring it or email it to an IG officer for proofreading. When it's ready to distribution, you can bring copies to the IG and send it electronically to the Butterflyer Editor for publication as well as bring to as many OA meetings as you can.
- 7. Sponsoring an OA event is a stimulating way to spread the message, and an exciting tool in all the participants' recovery. Be sure to start brainstorming ideas early enough to secure the IG involvement and to allow for time for publication of the flyer. These considerations will help insure good attendance.
