Autonomy is a word that people stumble over about as often as they do over anonymity. What does it mean to us?

Autonomy is one of our most precious possessions. It means our freedom. It means that each group may make its own rules and run its meetings as it sees fit. We can modify or strengthen our requirements for speakers, leaders, and sponsors when we feel a need to do so. Our formats need not be identical, and we may choose our own form of abstinence. Our guide is group conscience, and we are free.

Free to be wrong? Undoubtedly. But we do find the ways of operating that work out best, in time. No one dictates to us. We are allowed to be responsible.

The limitation of this freedom is clearly stated: "Except in matters affecting other groups or OA as a whole." This means

that we must do nothing to the detriment of others. We may not tie ourselves to any sect, class, race, political group, or other segment of humanity. We must do nothing to expose OA to embarrassment, or cause needless dissension.

OA is for all who need it. For all of us who have received so much, it is our joyous privilege to help it grow, in whatever way we can.
